

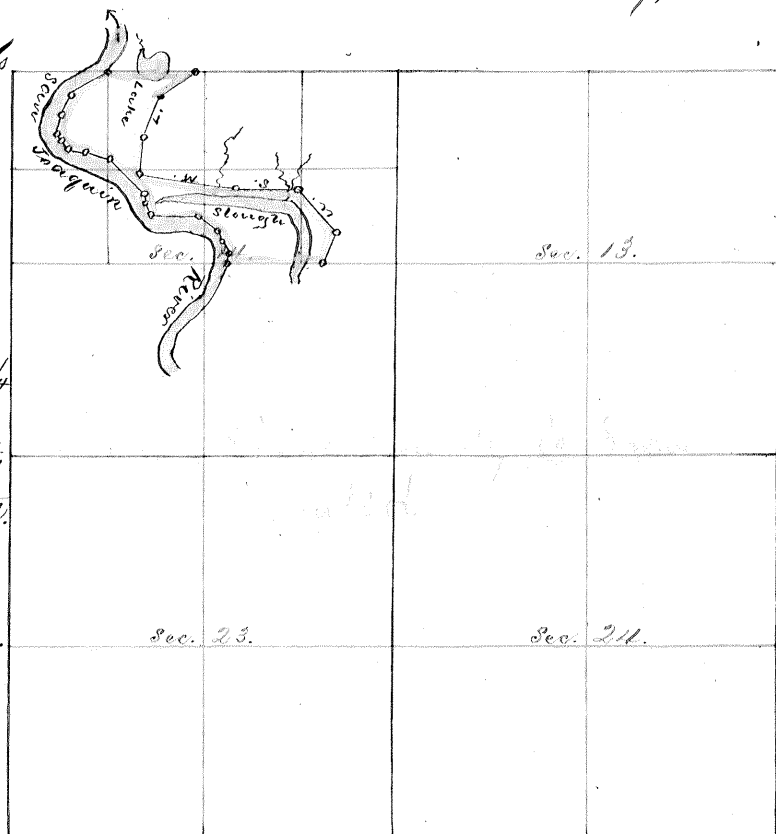

Run in full

Beginning at the U. S. Meander Post on the East and West Line between Sections 11 and 14, in Township 4 South, Range 7 East, Base and Meridian of Mount Diablo, Thence S $89\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W 18.00 chains to a Post set at the intersection of said Section Line with the right bank of the San Joaquin River; Thence Meander up Stream:— S $57\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W 9.00 chs; S 19° W 5.00 chs; S 4° W 3.50 chs; S 6° E 1.00 ch; S $22\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E 2.00; S $74\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E 4.00 chs; S $81\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E 5.00 chs; S $43\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E 11.00 chs; S $2\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W 2.00 chs; S 40° 2.50 chs; S 86° E 10.00 chs; S $53\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E 5.00 chs; South 1.80 chs; S $29\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E 3.00 chs; S $13\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W 2.19 chs. to a blazed Willow 3 inches in diameter, standing at the intersection of the $\frac{1}{4}$ Section Line E and W. in Section 14, with the right bank of said River; Thence East 20.65 chs. to a Post set at intersection of said $\frac{1}{4}$ Section Line with the U. S. Meander Line; Thence along said U. S. Meander Line, down Stream:— N $22\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E 7.00 chs; N 41° W 12.00 chs; N $88\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W 13.00 chs; N 83° W 20.00 chs; N $3\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E 8.00 chs; N $21\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E 9.00 chs; N $53\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E 9.02 chs. to the point of beginning;

Run by the true Meridian: Magnetic Variation $15^{\circ} 45'$ East.
