

VISIT:

Metro Lanza, L2

- Pinacoteca di Brera: very beautiful museum of paintings, with some of the most important Italian painters (Raffaello, Caravaggio, Mantegna, and also a Picasso). Behind it there's a hidden garden that you can visit for free, and it's one of the most quiet and beautiful corner of the city!
(Pinacoteca di Brera, Via Brera, 28)

Metro Pt. Venezia, L1

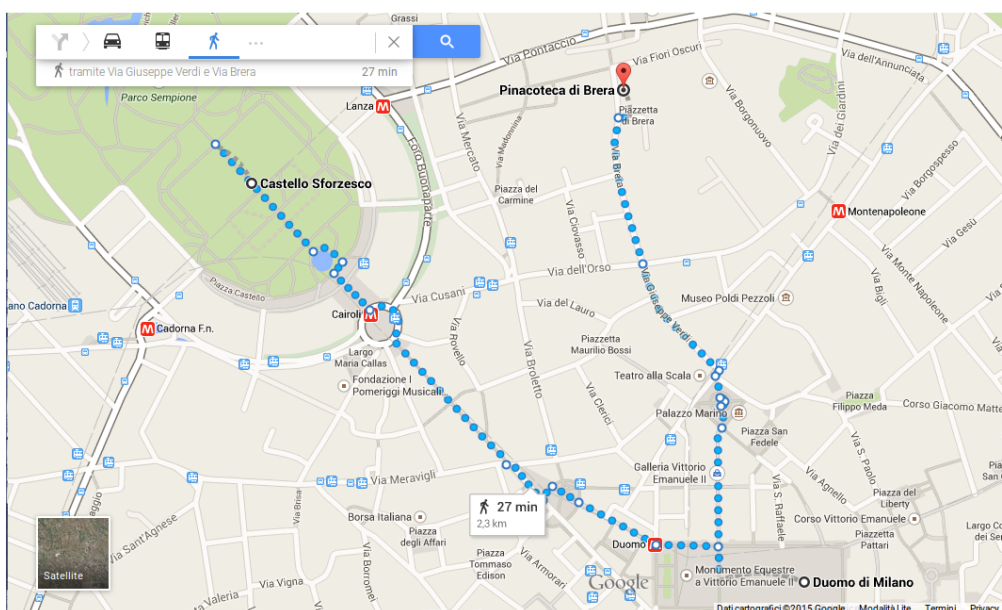
- Museo delle scienze naturali/Planetario: museum of biology. After 17:00 the entrance is free. It's also inside a public park.
(Giardini Pubblici "Indro Montanelli")

Metro Duomo, L1, L3

- Duomo di Milano: main cathedral, with the elevator you can go on the rooftop, from where you have a beautiful view of the city and the skyline, and in good days you can see until the Alps.
- Museo del '900: museum of paintings from XX century. After 20:30 the entrance is free. I recommend to go on the last floor from where you have a great view over the Duomo square and the Galleria.
- Galleria Vittorio Emanuele, at the end of it there's the famous opera theatre Alla Scala.

Metro Cairoli, L1

- Castello Sforzesco
- Parco Sempione, Arco della Pace
The Castle of the city with a beautiful fountain in front of it, and a big park behind that ends in an Arch inspired by the famous Arc de Triomphe of Paris.
- Corso Sempione, street with plenty of locals where to have an aperitivo



The way between Castello Sforzesco, Duomo and Brera, can be a good walk.

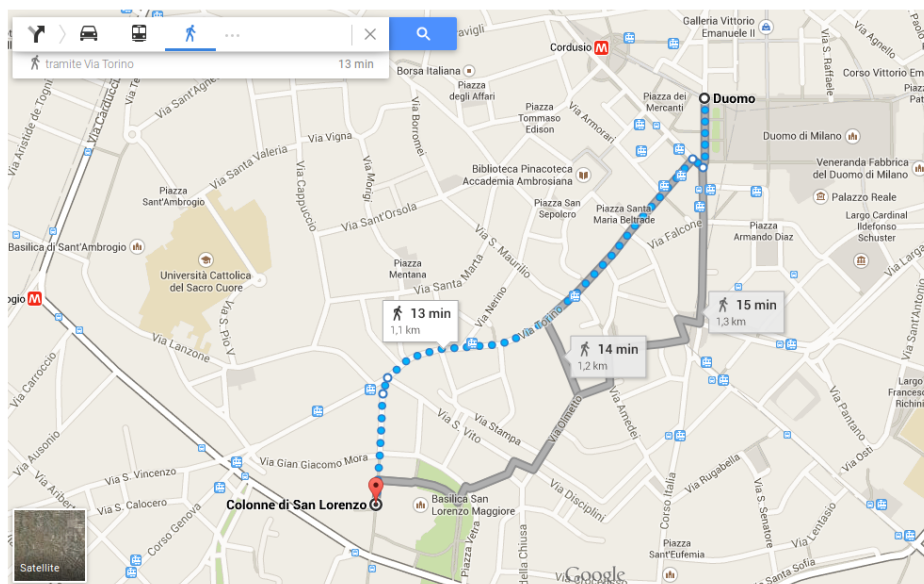
Metro Garibaldi, L2, L5

- Unicredit Tower: Italy's highest skyscraper, surrounded by new buildings (including Stefano Boeri's Vertical Forest, nominated 2015 Best Tall Building Worldwide)

BARS

Metro **Duomo**

- Colonne di S. Lorenzo: to hang out and drink something by night, walking from Duomo through via Torino until the Colonne di S. Lorenzo. There's a very cheap place where you can buy drinks and then just sit around the Colonne and have a good talk. It's always super-crowded, lot of young people!

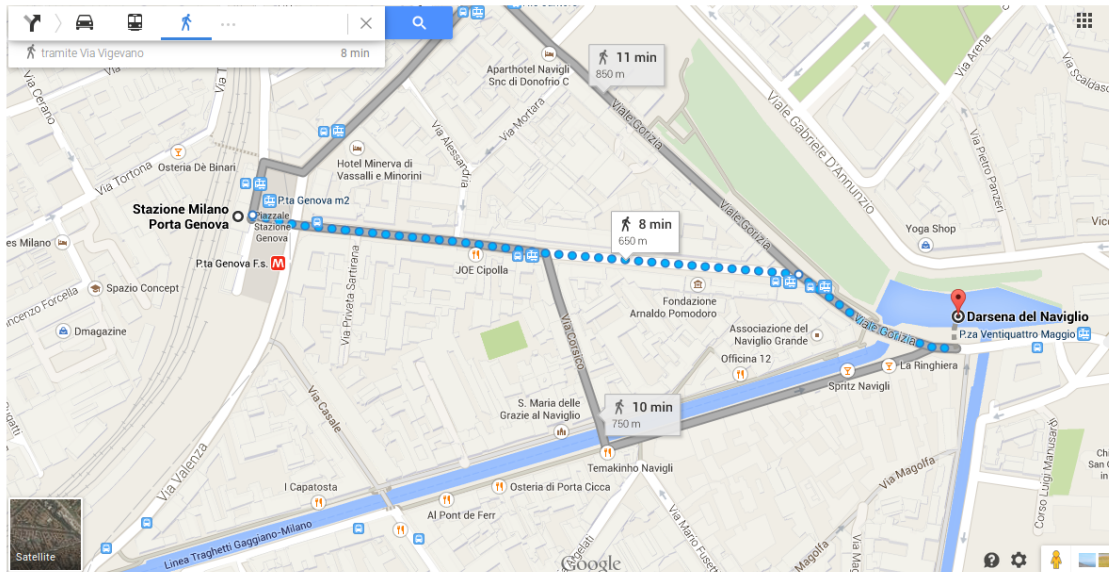


- Bar Luini: just behind the Duomo there's this place where to eat panzerotti (Via Santa Radegonda, 16) something that everyone who goes to Milan have to try at least once!

Metro **P.ta Genova**, L2

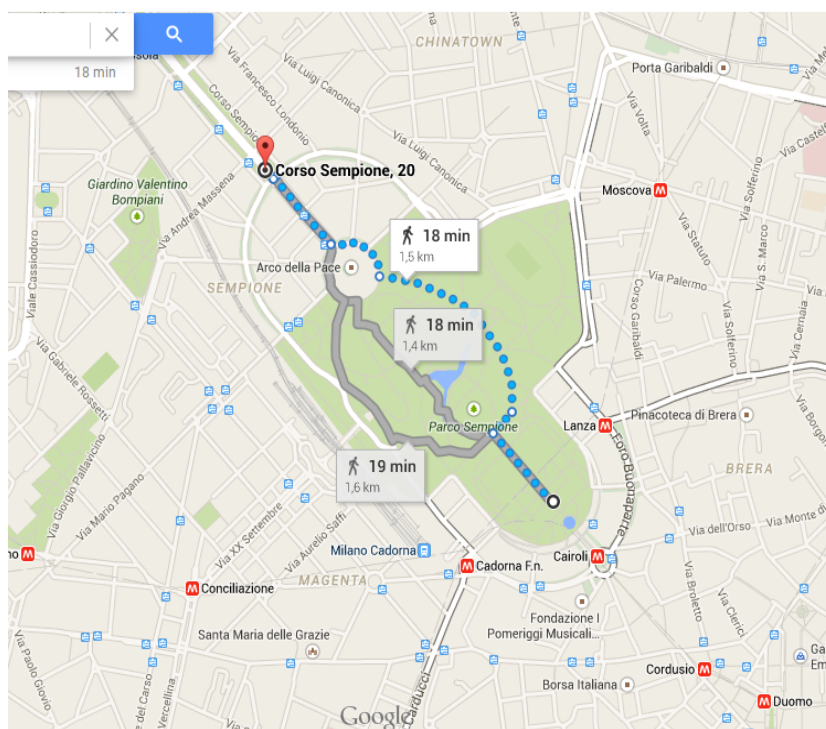
- Navigli: New York Times nominated the street that goes along Navigli one of the most beautiful.

Metro **Cadorna**, **L1**, **L2**

- Corso Sempione: at the end of Parco Sempione, where there's the Arch, there's this street full of bars and pubs where to have a good drink and hang out under the Arch. Very beautiful atmosphere.
Metro **Garibaldi**, **L2**, **L5**



- Corso Como: small street full of bars and restaurants. I recommend Corso Como 10, a very particular bar that is also a bookshop and a boutique. In summer you can also go on the rooftop and just sit there and relax enjoying the view of the city's skyline. The entrance is always free.
